Description of Activity *

Elevator Pitch:

Integrated Care Coordination supports people with complex chronic disease and their families to navigate the health system and to achieve better health outcomes. The Parkinson Support Nurse Service provides care coordination specialised for people diagnosed with Parkinson's disease.

Strategy 1: Continue to fund Integrated Care Coordination program for complex chronic conditions.

This program receives referrals from general practice and from the MLHD. The care coordination process involves direct engagement with the client and relevant carers, and a team based approach to care planning including case conferencing with the Client's GP. Clients are formally exited from the program after working towards their health goals and ability to self manage. The

provider is required to consult with the MLHD funded ICC program to ensure there is no duplication of service and to streamline referral processes..

Outcome 1: A client will have an improved health literacy and improved capacity to manage their chronic health condition, and will have received support to establish and engage with their care plan to set and meet their health goals.

Strategy 2: Continue to fund the Parkinson's support nurse position.

Parkinson's Support Nurse service provides care coordination specialised for people diagnosed with Parkinson's disease.

Outcome 2: People with Parkinson's disease experience coordinated care.

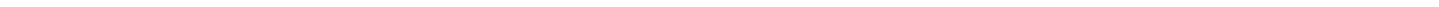
