# Aim of Activity \*

The project focuses on the enhancement of local palliative care service provision to improve access to safe, quality palliative care at home and support end-of-life care systems and services in primary care increasing community capacity.

# Description of Activity \*

#### **Elevator Pitch:**

This activity is to improve coordination of care and to ensure palliative patients and their carers receive safe and quality care, enabling people to be cared for and to pass away in their place of choice.

#### Description

MPHN employ a Project Manager and Project Officer responsible for the oversight and delivery of the identified activities.

#### Strategy 1

Description: Public Health Approach to Palliative Care

Development and delivery of a palliative care approach to improve the quality of life for carers, who are caring for someone at home with a life limiting illness, for example dementia. The activity will include an evaluation on improved outcomes for carers.

#### **Key Outcomes**

Increased carer knowledge of and linkage to dementia related supports and services

Increased carer confidence and skills in preventing potentially avoidable presentations to Emergency Departments

Improved community awareness that dementia is a life limiting illness

Improved community capacity to support carers who care for someone with dementia.

#### Strategy 2

Description: Multidisciplinary Approach to Care Planning

Embedding of current palliative care multidisciplinary team meetings.

Commencement of additional palliative care multidisciplinary team meetings.

#### **Key Outcomes**

Increased capability in primary care to provide quality palliative care.

Generation of palliative care specific data for ongoing quality improvement purposes.

Increased number of sustainable palliative care multidisciplinary team meetings.

#### Strategy 3

Description: Improving palliative care outcomes in general practice

- 1. Embedding and expanding the Palliative Care Outcomes Collaborative (PCOC) program in general practice, with the aim of improving access to quality palliative care at home, by improving patient outcomes through the routine assessment of palliative care needs.
- 2. Implementation of a quality improvement process into general practice, to prompt quality improvement care coordination initiatives.

Generation of palliative care specific data for ongoing quality improvement purposes.
